#### **School Improvement Goals**

<u>Math</u>: There will be an increase in the percentage of students in each grade level 4-5 that make expected growth as measured by the 2015 Iowa Assessments for Mathematics.

#### **Action Plan**

- UCILT members attended RtI Institute

#### **School Improvement Goals**

#### KA Annual Building SMART Improvement Student Learning Goal - Reading:

- 1. All Karen Acres students will be proficient in reading comprehension as measured by Fountas & Pinnell Benchmarking during each of the trimester windows of the 2014-2015 school year.
- 2. All KA students in grades 4 and 5 will make expected growth in reading comprehension as measured by the 2015 Iowa Assessments.

#### **Annual Building SMART Improvement Goal - Culture and Climate:**

1. There will be an increase in the percent of students from 13-14 to 14-15 who feel all KA students treat each other with respect as measured by the Spring Student Survey.

#### **Action Plan**

#### Reading Trimester I and II:

- 1. Study and implement the quality indicators of the second phase of the Gradual Release of Responsibility Model (Guided Instruction).
  - a. Read and discuss chapters 1-3 of <u>Better Learning Through Structured Teaching</u>, by Douglas Fisher and Nancy Frey.
  - b. Be observed and observe others (critical friend and grade level partner) during the literacy block using the Gradual Release of Responsibility Quality Indicators for phase II Guided Instruction.
- 2. Use Reading Wonders formative assessments to respond instructionally each week to student learning needs during literacy instruction.
  - a. Collaborate with grade level PLC to analyze results and determine action steps using the PLC log questions and data template.
  - b. Collaborate with grade level PLC to determine which weekly formative assessment(s) will best indicate student understanding of learning target(s).

## **Reading** Trimester III:

- 1. Study and implement the quality indicators of Phase I (Focused Instruction Purpose and Modeling) of the Gradual Release of Responsibility model
  - a. Reread and discuss Chapter 2 <u>Better Learning Through Structured Teaching</u>, by Douglas Fisher and Nancy Frey, and other literature authored by Doug Fisher and Nancy Frey (ex. The Purposeful Classroom)
  - b. Continue to work with critical friend and grade level partner to observe each other's lessons (Phase 1 Purpose and Modeling) and provide feedback on areas of growth and improvement using a standardized template
- 2. Use weekly formative assessments to respond instructionally during literacy instruction.
  - a. Work with PLC to develop a desired state of functioning that addresses the 4 questions.

#### **Culture/Climate** Trimester I and II:

- 1. Decrease number of referrals pertaining to location (playground) and incident type (shoving/inappropriate physical contact)
  - a. PE teachers will teach students the rules of organized activities (football, soccer) and also introduce other recess ideas.
  - b. Provide feedback to students once instruction takes place to determine additional instruction that needs to occur.
  - c. Provide training and review to staff on what warrants a pink behavior slip and what doesn't in order to capture accurate building-wide behavior data.

- d. Provide training to recess supervisors on how to reduce and effectively respond to student behaviors on playground.
- 2. Provide instruction, modeling and feedback of school-wide behavior expectations each trimester.
  - a. Using feedback from ARC members and associates, create talking points and determine who is responsible for delivering instruction.
  - b. Teach and model school-wide behavior expectations and provide feedback to students using a checklist.

- 2. Provide explicit instruction in the area of behavior using the MTSS Model (Multi-Tiered Systems of Support: Universal/Targeted/Intensive)
  - a. Teach lessons each month in Cougar Dens that focus on respect and caring.
  - b. Teachers across the building will celebrate areas of success (especially in the area of respect and caring) as related to individual classroom mission statements each Friday after morning announcements.

#### Data

# Summarize the performance and implementation data that was collected and analyzed this year as staff periodically reviewed the school improvement goals. Reading Goal:

Teachers were asked to rate themselves at both the beginning and end of the "Do" phase of our PDSA cycle each trimester using a rubric that measured their implementation of the instructional components of the Gradual Release of Responsibility model. The percentages increased in all areas for teachers, which evidenced a greater degree of understanding and implementation of establishing purpose, modeling and guided instruction.

Self-Assessment Percentages for Nov. 2014/Feb. 2015

Phase I (Purpose and Modeling) staff who rated themselves at a 3 or higher on each component of the rubric:

A (Lesson contains content, language, and social purposes and is based on formative assessment.) = 10% to 83%

B (Students can explain purposes in their own words: what they are learning, how they show their learning and why they need to learn this lesson.) = 50% to 83%

C = (Teacher provides an authentic model or demonstration while noticing student responses.) 60% to 92%

Phase II (Guided Instruction) Nov. 2014/Feb. 2015

A (Teacher scaffolds support for students using questions, prompts, and cues.) = 20% to 75%

B (Teacher differentiates instruction and practice based on formative assessment.) = 40% to 83%

Phase I (Purpose and Modeling – Indicators of Success (March 2015/May 2015)

A (Purpose is established for both content and language outcomes and is based on formative assessments.) = 44% to 89%

B (The essential lesson elements of guided, collaborative and independent tasks accurately reflect the established purpose.) = 67% to 100%

C (Students can explain the purpose in their own words.) =44% to 78%

D (Teacher provides and authentic model.) = 67% to 100%

E (Students use strategies and skills that were modeled.) = 100% to 100%

Weekly formative assessments were given to students to measure their understanding of the week's comprehension and vocabulary skills. The Reading Wonders curricular materials included an online assessment that provided instant feedback to teachers about their students' performance. Teachers used the results of these weekly assessments as part of the "Study" phase of the PDSA instructional cycle, as well as to guide their work as a Professional Learning Community. Instructional decisions were made about those students needing reteaching and enrichment of the week's skills within the week's lessons. The building leadership team felt that the data collected to assess grade level performance of weekly formative assessments wasn't the best measure because it didn't capture individual student growth. Teachers noticed that as the weeks progressed within the literacy units, individual scores increased. Skills that were once below proficiency began to improve to a new level of proficiency. The spiraling of concepts and skills reemerging during various units provided opportunities for students to deepen their understanding and improve performance. The data did, however, capture the total percentage of students who scored at proficiency, which was 80% or higher. The overall weekly averages of the formative assessments below reflect the weekly averages of all grade levels. Again, the data don't give a true picture of individual student growth, but it has served a place to start for the first year of implementation of Reading Wonders at every grade level. The encouraging thing that we considered as a building was that as the year progressed and the text complexity within each assessment increased, students continued to show growth. This meant that students were able to read more challenging stories than they were at the beginning of the year and still demonstrate a high degree of proficiency of those skills being assessed.

Data - Percentage of K-5 students reaching 80% proficiency or higher each week on Reading Wonders weekly formative assessments:

#### Culture and Climate Goal:

Behavior incidents on the playground for each trimester were as follows: 43 - 25 - 29. This indicates improvement from fall to spring. The winter data, 25, is usually less than the fall, but it is promising to see that the spring data is much less than that of the fall, even when weather is similar for both seasons and outdoor recess is typical.

In an effort to collect formative feedback on a monthly basis from students, a survey was given each month when students were in their advisory groups, called "Cougar Dens". Our building leadership team wanted to capture student perception on an ongoing basis, rather than waiting until the survey in May, to track progress more closely. Percentages stayed fairly consistent in each category each month, with the exception of November: "I am kind towards others", which went from 70% to 96% and 96% and 98% in the months following.

November:

I am safe towards others – 95%
I am kind towards others – 70%
Others are safe towards me – 87%
Others are kind towards me – NA (question was added in December)

December: (survey questions were revised to make more sense to students)

I am safe towards others -91%I am kind towards others -96%Others are safe towards me -85%Others are kind towards me -83%

#### January:

I am safe towards others -94%I am kind towards others -96%Others are safe towards me -84%Others are kind towards me -82%

February – no data collected

March (end of data collection): I am safe towards others – 93% I am kind towards others – 98% Others are safe towards me – 93% Others are kind towards me – 86%

# Summarize performance and implementation data that were used to determine whether or not the school met annual improvement goals.

Reading Goal #1: Our reading goal was not met. All students were not proficient in reading comprehension as measured by Fountas & Pinnell Benchmarking during each of the trimester windows of the 2014-2015 school year. However, the percentages indicated increased student proficiency in almost all grade levels. The data below indicate this growth:

Additional data that are important to note are that at least 80% of students at every grade level were proficient as measured by the district's universal screener called *FAST*, which measures fluency and accuracy, as well as other sub-skills in the primary grades. Those data are documented below. The 80% mark is important because it means that a tiered system is "healthy". Interventions can be provided for students in the top 20% of a system more effectively than if they were needed for more than 20% of a population.

Reading Goal #2: Our reading goal was not met. However, much growth was made at every grade level and in the advanced category.

Iowa Assessment reading results indicated a jump in the percentage of total students proficient from 2014 to 2015, going from 68.8% to 81.4%. The percentage of advanced students jumped from 22.6% to 32.4%. The table below shows the percentage of change form 2014 to 2015 for each grade level.

All subgroup data (IEP, ELL, F/R Lunch) also showed growth from 2014 to 2015, as shown in the table below. The performance of students in these areas provides promising evidence of achievement in the area of reading.

Culture and Climate: Our goal was met. Comparing spring survey results from 2014 to 2015, the percentage of KA students who feel they treat each other with respect all or most of the time went from 59% to 79%. In addition, the percentage of students who feel safe on the playground all or most of the time went from 79% to 92%. Behavior referral incidents on the playground went from 43 during trimester I to 29 during trimester III, which also supports growth.

#### Next Steps:

#### Karen Acres Annual Goals for 2015-2016:

85.1% of 3rd – 5th Grade students at Karen Acres Elementary School will be proficient or advanced in the area of **reading** as measured by the Iowa Assessments Reading test.

93.8% of 3rd – 5th Grade students at Karen Acres Elementary School will be proficient or advanced in the area of **math** as measured by the Iowa Assessments Mathematics test.

93.8% of 3rd – 5th Grade students at Karen Acres Elementary School will be proficient or advanced in the area of **science** as measured by the Iowa Assessments Science test.

81% of 5th grade students at Karen Acres Elementary School will be hopeful as measured by the Gallup Student Poll **hope** scale in the 2015-2016 school year.

#### **School Improvement Goals**

What are the school's annual improvement goals for 2014-15?

Olmsted Elementary School had three annual improvement goals during the 2014-15 school year.

- Reading: In the 2014-15 school year, 100% of Olmsted Elementary School students will be proficient or advanced in reading comprehension as measured by the Iowa Assessments, Fountas & Pinnell benchmarks, and the FAST Assessment.
- 2. **Quality/Continual Improvement**: In the 2014-15, 100% of teachers at Olmsted Elementary School will implement CCI Steps 1-8 with depth of understanding and fidelity as measured by the CCI Steps 1-8 Fidelity Matrix.
- 3. **Culture-Climate**: In the 2014-15 school year, 100% of staff, students, and families will feel that Olmsted Elementary is a school 1) that is safe and secure 2) makes kids feel special 3) and ensures that all students learn at high levels measured by data points from Gallup Survey results implemented district-wide.

#### **Action Plan**

Summarize the actions in which the staff was engaged, for the purpose of achieving the school's annual improvement goals.

Below in the chart is a snapshot of actions which staff were engaged in at Olmsted Elementary during the 2014-15 school year.

Additionally, Olmsted teachers engaged in "Data Days" each 6-weeks of the school year to analyze data from the FAST Assessments. Data was used to inform teachers about next steps with instruction, discuss new strategies and/or interventions to pursue for students, parent/family communication about progress, and a end of year report on all students to pass along to next year's classroom teachers.

In March 2015 for our final Olmsted Strategic Plan 60-Day Review, I introduced a new leadership structure at Olmsted Elementary where our UCILT members serve as "Goal Champions" of three Goal Teams. The purpose of this approach was to actively engage all teachers in our Olmsted Strategic Planning and Goal work.

To create our Goal Teams, every teacher (including Specials and Specialist teachers) selected which goal they would like to be engaged in working with, they ranked these in order of their preference (i.e. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>). The UCILT and I then developed compatible teams to carry out our work.

**Reading** Goal Team focus: Analyze school-wide reading achievement data to inform instructional practices, develop and/or provide high-quality professional development for staff in the area of literacy

**Quality/Continual Improvement** Goal Team focus: Quality/Continual Improvement, Olmsted best practices, Teach Like a Champion and high-yield strategies/routines, Determine what is "tight & loose" to reduce variation throughout our school, Establish common language for expectations, Power Standards

**Culture-Climate** Goal Team focus: Responsive Classroom – Creating a strong classroom culture and positive classroom/learning community, Making Olmsted a GREAT school! Safety and security (physiological and emotional), Making kids feel special, All students can learn at high levels, Home-school connections, Social-emotional

Between March-April 2015, our "Goal Champions" led the Goal Teams through a process utilizing quality tools to develop a status report and action plan to be the solid foundation of our 2015-16 Olmsted Strategic Plan. This important work included and purposeful planning of future professional development and activities to support teachers in achieving the aspects of our building goals.

#### Quality tools utilized:

- 1. Bone Diagram to capture the current reality, desired state, driving forces, and preventing forces for each goal area
- 2. Inter-relationship to determine the one preventing force that we must focus on to enact change moving forward
- 3. Morphing to develop an action plan for professional development and activities to engage in during the 2015-16 school year (the UCILT then assigned timeframes to each morphing/action step to accomplish our work in the most efficient way, as well as initial development of 2015-16 building goals)

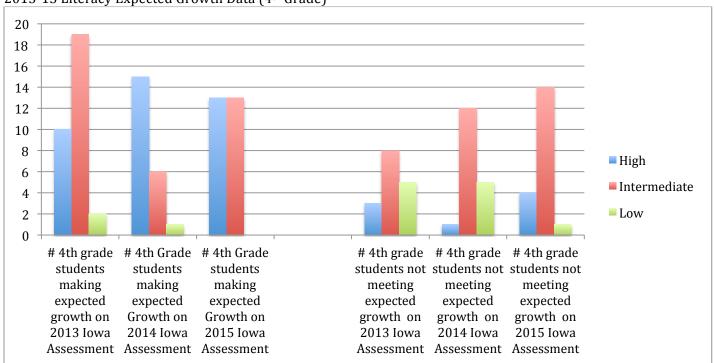

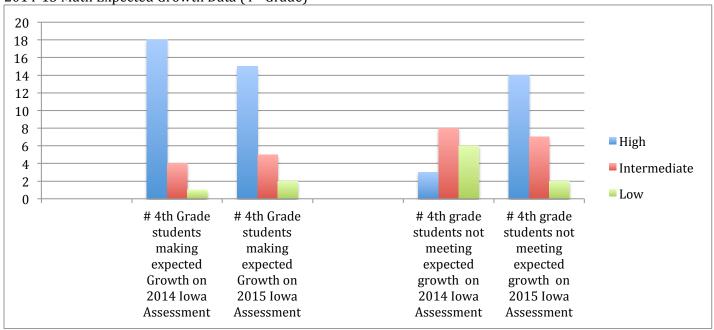

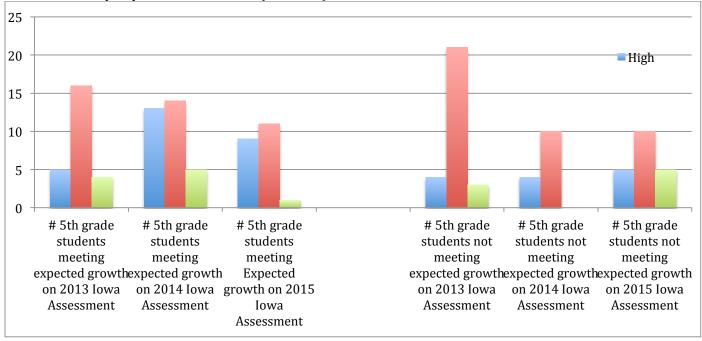




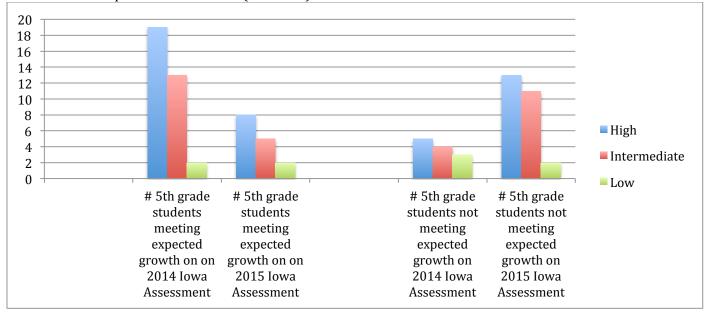




2013-15 Literacy Expected Growth Data (5th Grade)



2014-15 Math Expected Growth Data (5th Grade)

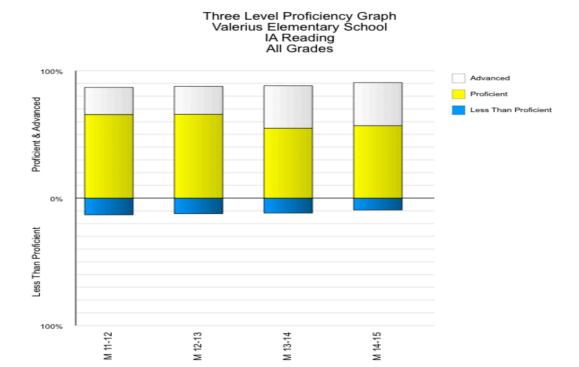


#### **Analysis:**

- Addressing these trends will be a part of our 15-16 school year action plan.

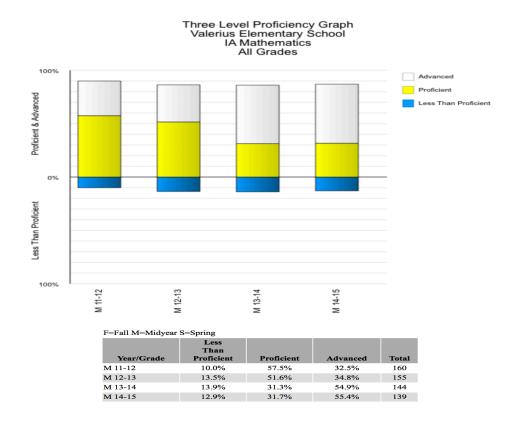

The numbers in the charts represent the combined number of students who scored proficient or advanced on the Iowa Assessments. Each data point increased with just a few exceptions. As Urbandale High School has put considerable effort into improving reading scores in the building, it's gratifying that our All Students' scores in reading increased 2%. A review of additional data indicated that much of the growth that took place in reading was within the special education and ELL population. This is encouraging because many of our non-proficient scores have traditionally come from those populations.

The Data indicates a decrease in the number of tardies over the course of three years. This decrease occurred despite the elimination of the external motivation practice of the opt out program. We have found that by placing an increased emphasis on tardies by developing an operational definition for a tardy and improved the practice and consistency of reporting tardies according to that definition, our tardies have decreased. As well, feedback from students has indicated that when worthwhile, engaging activities are taking place in the classroom, they will be to class on time.

Hi Chris,

There are times when we must contract with a charter company because activities events overlap with our regular route times. So even though a charter company was used, they are considered regular busing. Therefore, a quick vendor history report on Windstar won't differentiate between an 'intentional' use as opposed to a 'necessary' use. Charter buses must be used even for local trips when a Durham school bus would have been the first choice.

We only intentionally use charter buses for locations outside of the metro and surrounding area, or what Dr. Watson refers to as 'outside the golden circle.' These locations would include Mason City, Fort Dodge, Ottumwa, Cedar Rapids, Council Bluffs, or out of state. Charter buses for 'extra' trips such as those taken by performing arts during the summer or during breaks, are paid/reimbursed by booster clubs or parents, and are not a District expense.

I just need clarity on what level of detail you are requesting, because this will affect how we research and compile the data. I can certainly run a quick vendor report on both Durham and Windstar, but it won't tell the story as to where and why. We will need to check Activities Office records and then pull individual invoices to compile costs for the trips when a charter bus was our first choice.

#### **Background information:**

In the past, our contracted bus company charges were calculated with a mix of mileage and driver time. Now, we are charged only a higher flat rate per hour based on trip time only. It ends up being higher for local trips, and lower (in comparison with Windstar) for longer trips. So in the end, it's very similar to total non-route costs in the past.

It is typically more economical to use Durham than Windstar, as is evident above. However, there is a finite number of Durham buses. So our Activities Department and Durham Distpatcher work together to adjust the logistics of each non-route trip in order to use the Durham fleet as efficiently as possible. For example, if there are multiple events happening at the same time, local destinations can be covered by Durham by shuttling students and/or making multiple trips to same venue. If a charter is needed, it will be used for those trips that are farther away, since using a Durham bus would make it unavailable for routes or shuttles.

SUBJECT: REVIEW OF SPECIAL EDUCAITON EXPENSES

Dear Board Members,

In response to the significant increase in salary and benefit expenses reported on the 2014 Special Education Supplement (SES) to the District's Certified Annual Report (CAR), a review of expenses was conducted and I now submit the findings.

In the fall of 2014, Shelly Clifford, Chief Financial Officer, Jason Volmer, Special Education Coordinator, and Maggie Lichtenberg, Human Resources Manager, worked together to verify costs. Mr. Volmer and Ms. Clifford that all teacher labor expended to Special Education was correct. Mr. Volmer and Ms. Lichtenberg verified that all teacher associates listed on the expense reports were working in special education. While they found that a couple employees were expended to the wrong level (ie: were coded to Level I, and should be Level II) all were verified to be Special Education expenses.

The increase of over \$560,000 in teacher/prof category was verified to be a combination of additional teachers for Early Childhood programs, behavior analysts hired for 2014, and long term subs. No expenses were found to be in error, except that certain labor expenses of extended year programing during the summer was expended to FY14 but should have been accrued as payable in FY13.

Ms. Clifford submitted several reports to the Board of Directors showing comparisons of labor costs for the month of October for 4 fiscal years. The one-month increases multiplied to annualize costs suggest that the SES reporting is correct, as is shown in the comparison document attached. After Mr. Volmer spoke to the Board of Directors about the special education programing in the spring of 2015, and the Directors reviewed reports, questions still remained as to the accuracy of special education teacher associate expenses, which increased by over \$300,000 between FY13 and FY14. Shelly Clifford, CFO reviewed teacher associate expenses and provides this summary of findings:

Veritime timesheet system shows 104 associates using the system in FY13 and 202 users in FY14. The system shows total paid time of 82,066 hours in FY13 and 136,193 in FY14. Accounting records for the month of October show that in 134 associates were paid in FY13 and 168 were paid in FY14. Reports are attached showing detail. Using conservative numbers we can estimate that 34 additional associates working 4 hours per day (conservative average) for 180 days would cost in excess of \$300,000. In addition, a review of several monthly payroll files show dozens of timesheets for substitutes for special education associates that are inputted manually and not recorded in the Veritime system.

My internal review indicates that the SES expenses reported are correct in total, and that the only error found was that a small portion of costs were expended to FY14 that should have been FY13.

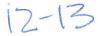

## URBANDALE CSD CODE REVIEW

This document outlines the results of the code review. Each item has a description of the issue and an estimate involved. Some of the items, especially related to events, are very interdependent and so it's possible that we may end up in a situation where we are forced to do some things that we had identified as low-priority in order to fix something that we identified as high-priority.

If we come across any additional issues that may affect our ability to fix others, we will notify Urbandale CSD as soon as we come across them.

#### **Events metadata**

**Issue:** During the event import process, the "metadata", or pieces of information attached to the event such as start time, end time, and location, are not deleted along with the other events, and as a result, there are over 12 million abandoned rows in this single table. (As a reference point, there shouldn't be more than about 20,000 rows here if everything was normal.) This enormous quantity of data is growing daily, and it could cause a database crash at some point if it is not addressed.

**Fix:** Adjust the import process to correctly delete the data, and remove all abandoned or "orphaned" rows from this table.

Severity: High

**Estimate:** 8 hours

#### **Galleries**

**Issue:** The current method of adding photo galleries via the "Galleries" section in the admin is fine, but it involved hacking a plugin that is used throughout the site for a number of other things, meaning this plugin can never be updated.

**Fix:** There are more future-friendly ways of creating these galleries, and we would recommend that this be switched over at some point so that the plugin can return to its original state and can be updated in the future. Some other features might be dependent on this plugin being updated if they require a newer version of the plugin.

# RESOLUTION TO CONTINUE PARTICIPATION IN THE INSTRUCTIONAL SUPPORT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has determined that to continue the current level of services and to fund the ongoing programs of the School District, continuation of participation in the Instructional Support Program for a period of five years is necessary and in the best interests of the District and its residents and students; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has given consideration to continue participation in the Instructional Support Program as provided in Iowa Code sections 257.18 through 257.21; and

WHEREAS, the Board has published notice of the time and place of a public hearing on the Resolution; and

WHEREAS, a hearing has been held upon the proposal to continue participation in the Instructional Support Program and any objections are overruled:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED:

- 1. The Board of Directors determines that it is consistent with the five year finance plan to fund the ongoing programs and services of the School District and it is in the best interest of the School District to continue participation in an Instructional Support Program as provided in Iowa Code sections 257.18 through 257.21, and to provide additional funding therefor for a period of five (5) years commencing with the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017.
- 2. Moneys received by the District for the Instructional Support Program may be used for any general fund purpose.
- 3. The Instructional Support Program will be funded by instructional support state aid and an instructional support property tax in an amount (after taking into consideration instructional support school aid) not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the total regular program district cost for the budget year and moneys received under Section 257.14 as a budget adjustment in the budget year, to be levied annually upon the taxable property within the School District commencing with the levy for collection in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017.
- 4. Unless, within twenty-eight days following the adoption of this Resolution, the Secretary of the Board receives a petition containing the signatures of eligible electors equal in number to not less than one hundred or thirty percent of the number of voters at the last preceding regular school election, whichever is greater, asking that an election be called to approve or disapprove this action of the Board adopting the Instructional Support Program, this action of the Board is final and the Secretary is authorized and directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Department of Management.

In the event a petition containing the required number of signatures is filed with the Secretary of the Board within twenty-eight days of the adoption of this Resolution, the President shall call a meeting of the Board to consider rescission of this Resolution, or to direct the county commissioner of elections to submit the following question to the qualified electors of the School District at a special election.

If the Board determines to submit the question to the electors, the proposition to be submitted shall be as follows:

Shall the Board of Directors of the Urbandale Community School District, in the County of Polk, State of Iowa, be authorized for a period of five (5) years to levy annually, as determined by the Board, an instructional support property tax in an amount (after taking into consideration instructional support state aid) not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the total of regular program district cost for the budget year and moneys received under Section 257.14 as a budget adjustment in the budget year, to be levied upon the taxable property within the School District, commencing with the levy for collection in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017, to be used for any general fund purpose?
